

The project goal is to assist the Central Arizona Fire and Medical Authority in providing greater fire protection services to the Blue Hills section in the town of Dewey-Humboldt which currently has no water for fire protection. We are raising funds to purchase two 8,100 gallon water storage tanks (at a cost of \$22,000) that will be installed on CAFMA property in the Blue Hills area.

All funds received through grants to the Arizona Community Foundation Dewey-Humboldt Firewise Fund will be provided to the Central Arizona Fire and Medical Association in establishing a water source in the Blue Hills in Dewey-Humboldt. This area is in great danger of structural and wild land fires and is without water.

The June 2017 Goodwin wildfire that burned 28,500 acres posed a serious threat to the town of Dewey-Humboldt, requiring evacuations and reassessment of the town's severe vulnerability to wildfire. In line with its mission to serve and collaborate for a better Arizona, ACF, through the Dewey-Humboldt Firewise Fund, which also receives financial contributions through the fundraising efforts of Dewey-Humboldt Firewise (an approved and recognized member of the Firewise USA program and avid fundraiser for Arizona Community Foundation Dewey-Humboldt Firewise Fund) , will assist the Central Arizona Fire and Medical Authority ("CAFMA") in protecting the residents of Dewey-Humboldt from structural and wild land fires. All grant funds received will go toward the purchase of two 8,100 gallon water storage tanks to be provided to and installed on CAFMA property in the Blue Hills area of Dewey-Humboldt that has no water whatsoever for fire protection. The installation of these water storage tanks will immediately improve the safety of 1,065 residents living in 426 residences in the Blue Hills area, and potentially affect the safety of the entire population of the 4,043 residents of Dewey-Humboldt. Pending budget approvals in May/June 2018, the town of Dewey-Humboldt and CAFMA plan to make additional funds available to cover the cost for road and land preparation and installation costs. It is estimated that purchase of the tanks, preparation and installation of the tanks will be done by June 2019. Without additional water made available to the severely fire prone area of Blue Hills, the risk to property and the very lives of the families living in the immediate area and the Town of Dewey-Humboldt is extremely high.

Dewey-Humboldt Firewise (an approved and recognized member of the Firewise USA program and avid fundraiser for Arizona Community Foundation Dewey-Humboldt Fund) has a goal to raise \$22,000.00 for the purchase of two water storage tanks that will be given to CAFMA for installation on CAFMA-owned property located in the Blue Hills area of Dewey-Humboldt. All funds received through grants, as well as funds derived through Dewey-Humboldt Firewise fundraising efforts, will go directly into Arizona Community Foundation's Dewey-Humboldt Firewise Fund. To date, through the fundraising efforts of Dewey-Humboldt Firewise, private donations have been deposited into the Arizona Community Foundation Dewey-Humboldt Fund in the amount of \$7,003.21. Regardless of the amount of grant funding received, fundraising events will continue until the desired goal of \$22,000.00 is reached.


