VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR NOMINATIONS The Town of Dewey-Humboldt 2017 Volunteer of the Year Process Begins

Everyday Dewey-Humboldt volunteers generously give their time and service to help others. Now here is your chance to give back by nominating a deserving individual in The Town of Dewey-Humboldt for his/her outstanding service through the Town's Volunteer of the Year program.



Who is eligible? The nomination is open to all Dewey-Humboldt residents who have volunteered in 2017. Nominees need to have been volunteers for organizations that directly benefit the citizens of the Town of Dewey-Humboldt. The organization can be the Town Council, Town Boards/Commission/Committees, including the Planning and Zoning Commission, Open Space and Trail Committee, Firewise, Volunteers for the Town's Activity Center, the Town Library, the Historical Society, Humboldt Elementary School and other Agencies that have programs benefiting the citizens of the Town of Dewey-Humboldt.

Nomination Process: The process is simple. Please state the nominee's name, volunteer organization where the nominee volunteered in 2017 and why you believe the individual should be nominated, such as how his/her efforts volunteering in the specific organization have made a profound difference in citizens' lives. Only one nomination per paper please. Nominations can be written and submitted to Beth Evans at Town Hall, submitted via email to bethevans@dhaz.gov, or faxed to 928-632-7365 by 5:00p.m. Thursday, April 12, 2018.

Honoree Selection: The Town Manager appoints a Citizen Committee to review the Nominees and make the

recommendation to the Town Council. The Town Council decides whether to accept the Citizen Committee's recommendation. Nominees will be judged on their outstanding service to the citizens of Dewey-Humboldt. The Honoree of the "Volunteer of the Year" Award, along with all that have been nominated, will be recognized by the Town Council in May. This is a wonderful way for the Town to express its sincere appreciation for our volunteers and also a great opportunity for volunteers to inspire others through their stories.

VOTY Picnic: A picnic will be held at Butte Park on May 15, 2018 @ 4:00p.m. to recognize the Nominees and the Volunteer of the Year. The public is welcome.

CODE RED EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM



The Yavapai County Sheriff's Office now utilizes CodeRED® as its **Emergency Notification System.**

With this service messages can be sent to residents and businesses within minutes containing specific information when an emergency or time-sensitive issue arises.

Although **ENS** does contain published landline phone number information by default, landline phone data may only get updated twice a year. This is why it is **vital that you register all your phone numbers directly to assure contact in an emergency.**

By signing up, you also have the ability to enter alternate phone numbers and/or modes of contact. You may also specify your primary contact mode. The opt-in process will require that you have a valid email address. A confirmation email and/or text message will be sent upon completion of registration. This message will be sent from noreply@ycsoaz.gov and may take up to five minutes. Once registered, you may opt-out at any time.

When delivery of the alert to your primary contact fails, the system will automatically fall back to other methods. If the system detects an answering machine, it will deliver the message to voicemail. If there is no answer, the system will redial the number at a later time or, if specified, fall back to another contact mode.



PORK TENDERLOIN MEDALLIONS WITH STRAWBERRY SAUCE

- 1-1/2 cups beef broth
- 2 cups chopped fresh strawberries
- 1/2 cup white wine vinegar
- 1/4 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/4 cup soy sauce
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 lbs. pork tenderloin, in 1/2-inch slices
- 1 tsp. garlic powder
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. pepper
- 2 tbsp. canola oil
- 2 tbsp. cornstarch
- 2 tbsp. cold water
- 1/2 cup feta cheese
- 1/2 cup chopped green onions



In a large saucepan, combine broth, 1 cup strawberries, vinegar, brown sugar, soy sauce and garlic; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, 15 minutes or until slightly thickened. Strain. Set aside liquid, discard solids.

Sprinkle pork with garlic powder, salt & pepper. In a large skillet, heat oil over medium heat. Brown pork in batches on both sides. Remove & keep warm.

Add broth mixture to the pan; bring to a boil. Combine cornstarch and water until smooth and gradually stir into skillet.

Return pork to the pan. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cook and stir 2 minutes or until sauce is thickened and pork is tender. Top each serving with cheese, onions and remaining strawberries. Yield: 8 servings.


