TOWN CANDIDATE ELECTION UPDATE

The Town of Dewey-Humboldt is holding its Candidate Election on August 28, 2018. Seven Candidates' names will appear on the ballot for one Mayor seat and three Council seats.

They are as follows:

MAYOR (1 seat): Terry Nolan and Victoria Wendt

COUNCIL (3 seats): Karen Brooks, Lynn Collins, Mark McBrady, Doug Treadway and Nancy Wright.

The Clerk's Office is accepting write-in candidate nomination papers until July 19, 2018, 5:00 p.m. A write-in candidate is a candidate in an election whose names does not appear on the ballot, but for whom voters may vote, nonetheless, by writing the in the person's name.

You should see campaign signs going up around town starting June 29, 2018. State Laws prohibit tampering with (removing, altering or defacing) political signs. If you feel there is a sign creating a potential hazardous public safety issue, please contact the town.

The last day to register to vote in the Primary Election is July 30, 2018. You can register online at the Service Arizona website at servicearizona.com. Voter registration forms are also available at the Yavapai County Recorder's Office; Town Clerk's Office; Libraries throughout Yavapai County; Department of Motor Vehicles; United States Post Offices and the Arizona Secretary of State's website.

JOHN'S BEERCHUCK

From Outdoor Cooking

- 1 chuck roast
4-6 pounds (beef or game)
- 1 large onion, diced
- 1 can mushroom soup
- 1 small can diced green chilies
- 1/2 cup cooking oil
- 1 can good beer
- Garlic salt, salt and pepper

Heat oil (hot) in large cast-iron skillet or Dutch oven. When oil is good and hot sear roast on both sides. Add diced onion and chiles, smearing them all over roast. Add mushroom soup and beer, covering roast with mixture. Cover with lid and let simmer on low fire for 2 hours. It will fall apart. It fits temptingly into tortillas, pita pockets, or sourdough rolls.



DID YOU KNOW?....

As of July 1, 2009, **ALL** OHV's in Arizona need to be titled and display a license plate. There are two types of plates for OHV's. Plates with the letters "**RV**" indicate "title only" and **DOES NOT ALLOW** travel on city streets or highways. Plates with the letters "**MC**" have met the special requirements that **ALLOW** them to be designated "**street legal.**"

Regulations relating to OHV (Off-highway vehicle) use are mandated by the State of Arizona. The following regulations apply to **ALL** off-highway vehicles operated in Arizona and prohibit operation: 1) With reckless disregard for the safety of persons or property. 2) Off of an existing road, trail or route in a manner that causes damage to wildlife habitat, riparian areas, cultural or natural resources, or property or improvements. 3) On closed roads, trails, routes or areas. 4) Over unimproved roads, trails, routes or areas unless allowed by rule or regulation. 5) That cause damage to the environment as prohibited by rule, regulation, ordinance or code.
