DEWEY-HUMBOLDT ELECTION DATES

Starting on Tuesday, September 4, 2018 and continuing through Friday, September 7, 2018, the Town of Dewey-Humboldt will be conducting its **Fall Cleanup Program** and will be accepting discarded items.

Items that **will not** be accepted are: Tires; Oils; Hazardous Chemicals; Refrigerators/Freezers with Freon/Coolant Canisters Attached; Household Trash; Batteries.

We **will** be accepting brush and yard clippings, as this will be part of the Town Firewise Program.

Dumpsters will be available to handle your discards and a separate area will be available to receive brush and yard clippings for later chipping and mulching.

The hours will be 8:00–6:00 starting Tuesday, September 4th, through Friday, September 7th.

The location for the Fall Cleanup Program is the Town owned lot in downtown Humboldt, located at 12938 E. Main Street.

Following the Fall Cleanup Program, the Town will be making mulch

available from the chipping of wood, brush and yard clippings. The mulch will be available on an appointment basis, starting on Monday, September 10, 2018, from 8:00-5:00 each day until all of the mulch has been disposed of.

The day started dark and a bit overcast at 4:30am, but eventually the sun came up and then out from behind the clouds. By mid-afternoon the move was a complete success. Everything was safely moved without incident or damage.



IT'S FOR THE BIRDS! THE CENTRAL ARIZONA LAND TRUST AND PARTNERS RALLY TO SAVE KEY RIPARIAN AREA IN DEWEY-HUMBOLDT

Nestled in the heart of Humboldt, the lushness of the Coldwater Farm allows you to feel as if you have entered the Secret Garden. Owners Garry and Denise Rogers chose to call their home Coldwater Farm inspired by the flowing waters of the Agua Fria River that runs through their property. Noticing an abundance of bird species, Garry began keeping a bird list that is now up to 127 species. For instance, the southwestern willow flycatcher and the yellow-billed cuckoo

are using the Coldwater Farm for breeding, according to surveys by the Audubon Society,

Arizona Game and Fish Department, and the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service. These two species are considered Neotropical migrants and are listed as threatened and endangered, respectively.

Following the exciting results that the property was supporting two rare species, the Rogers Family contacted Central Arizona Land Trust (CALT) to begin considering a conservation easement for Coldwater Farm. Conservation easements are agreements between a willing property-owner and a land trust that protect the property from future subdivision and development in order to conserve areas that have important natural, ecological, scenic, and agricultural values. Coldwater Farm has high potential for habitat improvement, thereby increasing plant and animal diversity and abundance

across the property. Additionally, the water resources attached to the land will be protected by the easement, thus further supporting the conservation values.

CALT launched the *It's for the Birds* campaign to raise the needed funds to cover necessary expenses for establishing the conservation easement and conserving the property in perpetuity. Enthusiastic support has come from Mayor Nolan and Council Members with a \$2,500 donation to the campaign. Additionally, local chapters of several conservation groups have stepped up early to promote Coldwater's protection and offered their support, including the Highlands Center for Natural History, the Prescott Audubon Society, the Citizens Water Advocacy Group, the Sierra Club-Yavapai Group, the Arizona Native Plant Society-Prescott Chapter, the Arizona Riparian Council, Friends of the Agua Fria National Monument, and the Upper Agua Fria Watershed Group

The conservation of Coldwater Farm could not happen without the vision and desire of the Garry and Denise Rogers to protect forever the rich abundance found on their land in Dewey-Humboldt. Their action demonstrates how conservation easements can be used by others along the Agua Fria River to create a 'green ribbon' of vibrant habitat for all to enjoy. The protection of Coldwater Farm needs your support to ensure that its conservation values are protected for future generations. 





PATRIOT WEEK SEPTEMBER 7-14

From Prescott Valley Town News, 8 2018

For the past six years, 3,000 American flags have graced the green lawns of the Prescott Valley Civic Center campus. In 2014, the year after 19 Granite Mountain Hotshot wildland firefighters lost their lives in the Yarnell Hill Fire, 19 memorial flags joined the field to honor their bravery and service.



The Healing Field is installed by community volunteers, firefighters, police, and Town of Prescott Valley Staff, and stays up around the clock for the entire Patriot Week each September. This year the flags will go up on September 7, and will be on display until noon, September 14.

On Tuesday, September 11, the Town will present a ceremony honoring those who lost their lives on 9/11/2001. The event will include the National Anthem played by Emmy award winning trumpeter Jesse McGuire, a keynote address by Judith Anderson, a teacher in New York at the time of the attacks, and appearances by the Central Arizona Honor Guard and Pipes & Drums, and the American Legion Post 6.

On Wednesday, September 12 at 6pm, trumpeter Jesse McGuire and the Yavapai College Brass Quintet will present a free concert of patriotic music at the Theater on the Green. The concert will move into the Library Auditorium if it rains.

ROASTED DELICATE SQUASH & ONIONS

From Eating Well

- 2 lb. delicate squash (about 2 large)
- 1 medium red onion, sliced
- 2 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. chopped fresh rosemary
- 1 tbsp. maple syrup
- 1 tbsp. Dijon mustard

Preheat oven to 425.

Cut squash in half lengthwise, then crosswise; scoop out the seeds. Cut lengthwise into 1/2-inch-thick wedges. Toss with onion, 1 tablespoon oil and salt in a large bowl. Spread in an even layer on a baking sheet.

Roast, stirring once or twice, until tender and beginning to brown, about 30 minutes.

Combine the remaining tablespoon oil, rosemary, syrup and mustard in a small bowl. Toss the vegetables with the dressing.
