NEWS FROM TOWN HALL

2018 PRIMARY ELECTION RESULTS

There were **2618** registered voters with **1213 ballots** cast which represents 46.33% of the total voter turnout at the 2018 Primary Candidate Election held on August 28, 2018. The official results are as follows:

Mayoral Incumbent Terry Nolan received the majority of votes, as well as Town Council Candidates Karen Brooks, Lynn Collins and Town Council Incumbent Mark McBrady. Pursuant to Town Ordinance §30.046, as all the above candidates received a majority of the votes cast, they are declared elected to the office for which they were a candidate and no further election shall be held.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORNER

WHAT IS A LOT COMBINATION?

The Town of Dewey-Humboldt works with the Yavapai County Assessor's office to make it possible for property owners to combine their lots into a new larger lot.

The Lot Combination process is a simple administrative action that takes approximately 2 weeks to accomplish.

The process starts with the completion of a Lot Combination application form that demonstrates that:

1. The names of the individuals holding title on each parcel match exactly.
2. The type of ownership on the titles is the same.
3. You must have approval of the Town.
4. If the lots are from different subdivisions, letters from each home-

owner's association approving the combination is required.

5. Parcels that are non-contiguous or separated by dedicated right-of-way cannot be combined.
6. Property taxes must be paid in full prior to existing parcels being deleted from the property rolls.


NO GROWN-UP MOVIE IN OCTOBER. INSTEAD . . .





IN MEMORY OF OUR FRIEND KEVIN LEONARD



Our good friend and Dewey-Humboldt Historical Society member Kevin Leonard passed away September 12th.

Kevin was a past President of the Historical Society and a driving force in creating our first Museum located on Main Street. Kevin had a passion for our local history and loved taking people out into the backcountry to visit old mining camps, Native American ruins and most of all, exploring abandoned mines.

There was nothing quite as exciting as watching Kevin practically run through the brush, convinced another

discovery was just over the next hill. In addition to leading many Historical Society Outings, he ran his own tour business taking visitors to mines he operated.

He had a true pioneering spirit and loved roughing it at his mining camp in the Bradshaw Mountains. He also shared his passion for the outdoors as an author of two books: Come Ride With Me and Some Trust In Horses.

Spending time with Kevin was a lesson that history isn't something just in books, lectures and dusty archives - he taught us to go out, explore and experience the thrill of discovering a piece of history first hand. His spirit, enthusiasm and friendship will be missed.

CUBAN BEANS & RICE

From Woman's Day

- 2 tsp. oil
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 cans (15.5 oz.) black beans, rinsed
- 1 cup water
- 1 1/2 tsp. ground cumin
- 1 tsp. dried oregano
- 1 tsp. smoked or regular paprika
- 1/4 tsp. pepper
- 1/2 each red, green, yellow bell pepper sliced
- 1/2 medium onion, sliced

Heat oil in large skillet over medium heat. Add garlic; cook 30 seconds. Stir in remaining ingredients. Bring to a simmer, cover and reduce heat. Cook 10 minutes until vegetables are tender and flavors have blended.

Serve with cooked rice, lime wedges, hot sauce. Serves 4.
