WINTER SNOW REMOVAL PLAN

Winter is upon us. In the event we receive heavy snow in the coming months, the Town Public Works Department has made sure the snowplow is ready to go in preparation for the cold weather.

The snow removal plan is as follows: Staff will start with the main collector/feeder roads throughout Town, then work into the smaller neighborhood roads. We will get to all Town owned roads as quickly as possible. The snowplow blade is wide and the truck has to move slowly in order to effectively remove the snow. When snow removal is in process, there may be traffic delays on Town owned roads. Your patience would be appreciated.

During a snowstorm, we also ask our residents to avoid parking vehicles on the roads. Vehicles parked on the roads may become an obstacle for the Town's truck to remove snow.

FIREWISE AT WORK 2018

- ◆ Received approval from Firewise USA for annual renewal of both of our Foothills and Blue Hills Certified Firewise communities
- ◆ Received certification from Firewise USA for an additional 339 parcels in D-H's Foothills East area, bringing the current total to 518 parcels.
- ◆ To date, Upper Blue Hills and Foothills East have received over \$48,000 in grant money from Prescott Area Wildland Urban Interface Commission (PAWUIC) for property abatement
- ◆ After budgeting \$250,000 for the Blue Hills Emergency Water Storage Tank project, Central Arizona Fire and Medical Authority (CAFMA) decided to add 2 additional 8,100-gallon tanks for a total of 32,200 gallons of water. These tanks will be filled by water tenders and not community water
- ◆ Received notice of grants from PAWUIC and from Yavapai County's Title 111 which will be awarded, beginning in Jan., 2019
- ◆ Expanded the efforts of our busy organization by electing an all-volunteer Board of Directors to oversee various aspects of our work. More to come about this in our January newsletter





ROASTED BRUSSELS SPROUTS, CINNAMON BUTTERNUT SQUASH, PECANS, & CRANBERRIES

3 cups Brussels sprouts, ends trimmed & yellow leaves removed, sliced in half

3 tablespoons olive oil

1/4 teaspoon salt to taste

1 1/2 lb butternut squash peeled, seeded, and cut into 1 inch cubes

2 tablespoons olive oil

3 tablespoons maple syrup

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

2 cups pecan halves

1 cup dried cranberries

2—4 tablespoons maple syrup optional

Preheat oven to 400. Lightly grease two foil lined baking sheets with 1 tablespoon of olive oil. In a medium bowl toss the sprouts, 2 tablespoons olive oil and salt to combine. Place on one baking sheet, cut side down. In another bowl combine cubed squash, 1 tablespoon olive oil, maple syrup, and cinnamon, and toss to mix. Place in a single layer on the other baking sheet. Bake both for 20—25 minutes, turning the sprouts during the last 5 to 10 minutes and the squash about half way through. In a large bowl combine the vegetables, pecans, and cranberries, and mix to combine. Add a little more maple syrup if desired.
