NEWS FROM TOWN HALL

TOWN MANAGER RESIGNS INTERIM TOWN MANAGER APPOINTED

At the December 4, 2018 Town Council Work Session, Town Manager, Tom Wilson, submitted his letter of resignation. The effective date of his termination was December 13, 2018.

During the recent Town Council Work Session on January 8, 2019, there was Council discussion of possible appointment of Ed Hanks, Public Works Director to serve as Interim Town Manager. At this meeting, Council approved appointing Ed Hanks as the Interim Town Manager until a permanent Town Manager can be hired.

In the following months, the Town will be searching for a new Town Manager. The vacancy will be posted via the Town website and other venues. If you or anyone you know is interested, please make sure to check the Town website at www.dhaz.gov for more information.

SPRING CLEAN UP

The Town is currently working on the details of our annual Spring Clean Up event to be held in May.

As part of the Town Firewise Program, we will be accepting brush and yard clippings. Dumpsters will be available to handle your discards and a separate area will be available to receive brush and yard clippings for later chipping and mulching.

Items that will not be accepted are: tires, oils, hazardous chemicals, batteries, household trash, refrigerators/freezers with freon/coolant canisters attached.

The location for the Spring Clean Up will be the Town owned lot in downtown Humboldt, located at 12938 E. Main Street. Dates and times to be determined.



WINTERTIME SAFETY TIPS Gas Fuel Appliances

Change out air filters, check appliances for gas leaks and check out exhaust and combustible air ventilation systems. It is recommended to have a licensed mechanical contractor do a complete check-up on the gas heating

system. A carbon monoxide detector is also a highly recommended device if you use gas-fuel appliances.

Smoke Alarms

Replace the batteries and **TEST** the alarms to make sure they are in good working order.

Wood Stove/Fireplace/Pellet Stove

Clean the flue/exhaust pipes regularly to ensure your appliances work more efficiently.

Doors and Windows

Replace any worn out weather stripping around the doors and windows.

VALUATION FEE SCHEDULE & REFUNDS

Building permit fees are calculated based on project valuation. A plan review is performed to determine the square footage of livable space, garage size, patio, electrical, plumbing etc., then, the cost for each item is determined using the Valuation Fee Schedule. The Valuation Fee Schedule provides for the cost of the building permit fee and plan review fee. **Town Code Chapter 150, Appendix A: Valuation and Fee Schedule** states building permits are calculated per the Yavapai County Valuation and Fee Schedule.

Once you are ready to proceed with a building permit and pay the

fees, please be aware that only a portion of the fees can be refunded. **Town Code Section 150.01 Building Codes Administrative Code; 109.07: Fee Refunds** provide for the following: The building official may authorize refunding the greater of \$25.00 or 25% of the building permit fee paid when no work and no inspections have been done on an issued permit. The building official shall not authorize the refunding of any fee paid upon a written application filed by the original applicant no later than 180 days after the date of fee payment.

We understand that planning for a building project is quite involved and often times means a big financial commitment. Before you begin, please give us a call at 928-632-7362 for some advice and consultation on the process.

DH HISTORICAL SOCIETY NEWS

The DHHS has received a check of \$209,827 from the estate of Betty Comfort. This is in addition to property at 2699 S Hill Street in Dewey-Humboldt. Betty Comfort was a long-term resident of Dewey-Humboldt, a recipient of the Volunteer of the Year award from the Town in 2014 and previously a member of the Dewey-Humboldt Historical Society. She passed away last April and left a portion of her estate to her sister, the DHHS and two other organizations.

At the Membership Meeting

in January it was agreed that a donation of this size would not be used to pay routine bills or cover expenses related to further fundraising. Rather, the funds would be reserved for a capital expenditure such as a future museum building and / or exhibits which honor Betty Comfort's memory and generosity to our community.

The family of past DHHS President Kevin Leonard, who passed away last September, recently donated the Iron King Water Tower to the Society in his memory. We hope to relocate the Water Tower from its current location on Main Street to our exhibits at Mortimer Farms and eventually to the site of a future museum.

The Historical Society is immensely grateful for these donations. This demonstrates that even without a museum, there is continuing interest and commitment to preserving the history of our community.

The Dewey-Humboldt Historical Society is a 501c3 non-profit organization with the mission to collect, preserve, exhibit and teach others about the unique farming, ranching and mining history of Dewey-Humboldt and the surrounding area. No Historical Society Board Member, Officer or volunteer collects any salary or financial compensation - all donations directly support the Society's mission.




