2018 VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR

WE  **VOLUNTEERS** Everyday Dewey-Humboldt volunteers generously give their time and service to help others. Now here is your chance to give back by nominating a deserving individual for his/her outstanding service through the Town's Volunteer of the Year program.

Who is eligible? The nomination is open to all Dewey-Humboldt residents who have volunteered in 2018. Nominees need to have been volunteers for organizations that directly benefit the citizens of the Town of Dewey-Humboldt. The organization can be the Town Council, Town Boards/Commission/Committees, including the Planning and Zoning Commission, Open Space and Trail Committee, Firewise, Volunteers for the Town's Activity Center, the Town Library, the Historical Society, Humboldt Elementary School and other Agencies that have programs benefiting the citizens of the Town of Dewey-Humboldt.

Nomination Process: The process is simple. Please state the nominee's name, volunteer organization where the nominee volunteered in 2018 and why you believe the individual should be nominated, such as how his/her efforts volunteering in the specific organization have made a profound difference in citizens' lives. Only one nomination per paper please. Nominations can be delivered to Beth Evans at Town Hall, emailed to beth-evans@dhaz.gov, or faxed to 928-632-7365 by 5:00 p.m. Thursday, April 11, 2019.

Honoree Selection: The Town Manager appoints a Citizen Committee to review the Nominees and make the recommendation to the Town Council. The Town Council decides whether to accept the Citizen Committee's recommendation. Nominees will be judged on their outstanding service to the citizens of Dewey-Humboldt. The Hon-

oree of the "Volunteer of the Year" Award, along with all that have been nominated, will be recognized by the Town Council at an upcoming Town Council meeting. This is a wonderful way for the Town to express its sincere appreciation for our volunteers and also a great opportunity for volunteers to inspire others through their stories.

PLANNING AND ZONING ADVISORY COMMISSION & BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT VACANCIES

SPRING CLEAN UP

The Town of Dewey-Humboldt will be conducting its annual **Spring Clean Up Program** beginning May 28th and continuing through May 31st. The location for drop off will be in downtown Humboldt at 12938 E. Main Street. The hours of operation will be from 8:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m.

As part of the Town Firewise Program, we will be accepting brush and yard clippings. Dumpsters will be available to handle your discards and a



separate area will be available to receive brush and yard clippings for later chipping and mulching.

Items that will not be accepted are: tires, oils, hazardous chemicals, batteries, household trash, refrigerators/freezers with freon/coolant canisters attached.

The Town will be making mulch available on an appointment basis beginning on Monday, June 3rd, from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. until all of the mulch has been disposed of.

CONSERVATION OF COLDWATER FARM MAKES HUGE PROGRESS

The Central Arizona Land Trust (CALT) has some very positive news on the *It's for the Birds* campaign. Launched in May 2018, the campaign seeks to permanently preserve Coldwater Farm by establishing a perpetual conservation easement. Located on the Agua Fria River in Humboldt, this property is a lush bird paradise. Two very rare species, the Yellow-billed Cuckoo and the Southwestern Willow Flycatcher, come to nest here in the spring, not to mention the 127 plus species that were documented on the property.

At the end of last year, a generous anonymous donor contributed \$20,000 so that CALT could set up a matching challenge campaign. The

campaign was further bolstered by significant donations from the Prescott Audubon Society and individual donors that raised just over \$18,000 as of December 31. As a result, CALT is only \$7,481 away from reaching the total fundraising goal.



The funds raised by the *It's for the Birds* campaign will be used to pay for the transactional costs associated with establishing the conservation easement and to set aside funds in trust for the permanent stewardship and legal defense of the easement.

In the Spring, CALT will be organizing donor field trips to Coldwater Farm in order to make people aware of this gem of riparian habitat. For more information and updates on CALT's website: www.centralazlandtrust.org.




