WE ♥ VOLUNTEERS 2018 VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR

Who is eligible? The nomination is open to all Dewey-Humboldt residents who have volunteered in 2018. Nominees need to have been volunteers for organizations that directly benefit the citizens of the Town of Dewey-Humboldt. The organization can be the Town Council, Town Boards/Commission/Committees, including the Planning and Zoning Commission, Open Space and Trail Committee, Firewise, Volunteers for the Town's Activity Center, the Town Library, the Historical Society, Humboldt Elementary School and other Agencies that have programs benefiting the citizens of the Town of Dewey-Humboldt.

Nomination Process: The process is simple. Please state the nominee's name, volunteer organization where the nominee volunteered in 2018 and why you believe the individual should be nominated, such as how his/her efforts volunteering in the specific organization have made a profound difference in citizens' lives. Honoree Selection: The Town Manager appoints a Citizen Committee to review the Nominees and make the recommendation to the Town Council. The Town Council decides whether to accept the Citizen Committee's recommendation. Nominees will be judged on their outstanding service to the citizens of Dewey-Humboldt. The Honoree of the "Volunteer of the Year" Award, along with all that have been

nominated, will be recognized by the Town Council at an upcoming Town Council meeting. This is a wonderful way for the Town to express its sincere appreciation for our volunteers and also a great opportunity for volunteers to inspire others through their stories.

SPRING CLEAN UP

The Town of Dewey-Humboldt will be conducting its annual **Spring Clean Up Program** beginning May 28th and continuing through May 31st. The location for drop off will be in downtown Humboldt at 12938 E. Main Street. The hours of operation will be from 8:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m.



As part of the Town Firewise Program, we **will** be accepting brush and yard clippings. Dumpsters will be available to handle your discards and a separate area will be available to receive brush and yard clippings for later chipping and mulching.

Items that **will not** be accepted are: tires, oils, hazardous chemicals, batteries, household trash, refrigerators/freezers with freon/coolant canisters attached.

The Town will be making mulch available on an appointment basis beginning on Monday, June 3rd, from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. until all of the mulch has been disposed of.

WHAT IS A LAND SPLIT?

The Town of Dewey-Humboldt has adopted a Land Split process to facilitate the division of smaller parcels without the necessity of going through a full subdivision process. A Land Split involves the division of land creating not more than three (3) parcels from a parent parcel that is 2 ½ acres or less in area, and where no new street is involved, for the purpose of sale or lease. Calculation of the three (3) splits allowed will be cumulative over the past five (5) years, and the applicant will be required to submit evidence of that history.

Proposed Land Splits require a pre-application conference with the Community Development Department to discuss the process to be followed and the requirements to be met. Those requirements will include:

- Legal description and parcel number
- A Land Split drawing, fully dimensioned and prepared to scale
- Proposed parcels, with parcels lines fully dimensioned
- Any rights-of-way within the property
- Locations and dimensions of any existing structures, wells and septic systems

Following approval of the preliminary Land Split drawing, it will be necessary to submit a record of survey of the proposed Land Split produced, signed and sealed by a registered Land Surveyor, and including the recording date, book and page, as well as a certification line for the signature of the Community Planner for

the Town.

Any Land Divisions that occur outside of the Town Land Split or Subdivision process will not be recognized for the issuance of building permits until the error is corrected.

(All proposed land splits that involve lots within a recorded subdivision shall be heard before the Town Council as a revision of the Final Plat, pursuant to Town of Dewey-Humboldt Code of Ordinances Section 152.11(B)(1).


BOOK SALE





BALD EAGLE CLOSURES

The area between [Lynx Lake](#) and Salida Gulch Trail is closed until June 30.

Bald eagles are rebuilding nests and courting in preparation for egg laying. This is a time when bald eagles are very sensitive to human activity, which can cause a breeding pair to abandon the breeding attempt. Once eggs are laid, a disturbance lasting 15 to 30 minutes can cause the nest to be abandoned.

Land management and wildlife officials ask for your help in protecting Arizona's bald eagles by honoring the bald eagle closures throughout the state.

Grants of up to \$2,000 are available to assist homeowners in our certified areas with costs of clearing your property for fire-safety purposes.

In 2016, Andie Smith, Assistant Fire Marshal with Central Arizona Fire and Medical Authority (CAFMA), did the first fire risk assessment for our Dewey-Humboldt community.



As a trained Fire Inspector, Andie worked with Firewise Director Vickie Wendt to help our community take first steps for fire safety. Her assessments determined the two most critical areas to be Blue Hills and Foothills. From there, D-H Firewise started with Firewise certification, education, and abatement grants for these areas. For those who choose to abate their property, Andie is one of the inspectors who works with them to begin the abatement process.

Andie also teaches community members about fire and life safety. On April 17, her talk addresses:

- ***Evacuation (Ready, Set, Go)***
- ***Code Red***
- ***Defensible space preparations***
- ***General safety issues (such as address numbers)***
- ***Some little-known information about how the fire department operates***
