## NEWS FROM TOWN HALL

### SPRING CHIPSEAL PROJECT

Over the next month, the Public Works Department will begin the annual **Spring Chipseal Project**. The project will entail a chip overlay of existing roads throughout town with a fog (a thin liquid oil) coating once the chips are applied.

There will be message boards up in the areas of **Kachina Road; Foothill Drive south of State Route 169; and Main Street east of Highway 69** for three days prior to the scheduled work. Please note the days that are scheduled and have the roads free of parked vehicles.

### PLANNING AND ZONING ADVISORY COMMISSION VACANCY

The Town has one vacancy on the Planning and Zoning Advisory Commission and is looking for a Dewey-Humboldt citizen to become a Commission member. The term on the Commission is four-years.

The primary responsibilities of the Commission are to participate in the development and implementation of the Town's General Plan; periodically review the Town's Capital Improvement Program; and perform such other planning functions as the Mayor and Town Council may direct.

If you would like to be considered for appointment to this position, please obtain and complete an application from the Town.

The Mayor and Town Council will review the applications, select a number of candidates and decide on the candidate to be appointed.

### ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS

Accessory Dwelling Units are permitted in the Town of Dewey-Humboldt and are often referred to as Granny Flats or Mother-in-Law units.

Accessory dwelling units are subject to the following requirements:

**A)** An accessory dwelling unit is permitted only on a minimum lot size of 70,000 square feet in the R1L and RMM Zoning



Districts and a minimum lot size of 35,000 square feet in the R1 Zoning District, and on all lots in the RCU District where the minimum lot size is 87,120 square feet.

**B)** Primary dwelling and accessory dwelling unit shall both comply with the setback regulations set forth in § 153.069 Density Districts of this code.

**C)** The accessory dwelling unit shall be serviced and metered by the primary structure electric utility hookups. Individual accessory dwelling unit septic systems may be approved where necessary in order to reduce sewer line extensions as authorized by the County Environmental Unit.

**D)** The primary and accessory dwelling unit structures shall share a common driveway or entrance.

**E)** An accessory dwelling unit structure shall not exceed 750 square feet in size or 25% of the total square footage of the primary structure living area under roof, whichever is greater.

**F)** An accessory dwelling unit shall comply with the separation requirements set forth in the Town Building, Fire and Municipal Codes.

**G)** A kitchen facility is permitted in an accessory dwelling unit structure.

**H)** An accessory dwelling unit shall be used to house a non-paying or non-reimbursing relative or guest.

**TEMPORARY HOUSING PERMITS**

Currently, Town Code of Dewey-Humboldt provides that the Building Official is authorized to issue a permit for temporary housing to be occupied during the life of an active building permit.

**Town Code Section 153.036 B (8)**

*“Occupancy of temporary housing, including travel trailers, recreational vehicles and single-wide manufactured homes during the construction of a permanent dwelling is allowed during the 24-month period after the issuance of a building permit (and the building permit remains valid).*

*A permit for the temporary housing must be obtained prior to occupancy of the temporary dwelling unit. One extension of time for use of temporary housing may be granted at the discretion of the Zoning Administrator or his/her designee for a period not to exceed the maximum life of the original building permit for the permanent dwelling which is 30 months from its issuance date (24 months plus one six-month extension). Further extensions will require a use permit.”*

Temporary housing permits must be applied for, approved and issued by the Building Official, prior to the occupancy of the temporary housing.





## DHHS HAS A SITE FOR THE FUTURE MUSEUM!

The **Dewey-Humboldt Historical Society** has announced plans for their future Museum in Dewey-Humboldt! On May 10th the Society formally closed on the purchase of a 2.88 acre parcel at **2581 South State Route 69**, on the east side of the highway between Humboldt Station and Billy Jack's Saloon & Grill. The location will provide outstanding visibility and access to the traffic on 69 in addition to providing plenty of space for both outdoor exhibits and the future Museum building.

Initially, all the outdoor mining exhibits will be relocated to the site and space will be set aside for the continued construction of the Stamp Mill. Then, a metal building will be constructed as the first phase of a Museum building.

The purchase of this property and move to a permanent location is made possible through the estate of **Betty Comfort**. Construction of the first phase of a building for the Museum is made possible through the estate of **Jean Cross**. Both of these wonderful women have entrusted the D-HHS with preserving and teaching others about the unique mining, ranching and farming history of our community.

Society President and Board Chair David Nystrom declared "We are truly humbled by the trust they have placed in our organization to carry on this legacy."
