THE UPPER BLUE HILL WATER TANKS HAVE ARRIVED!



On May 22nd, a dedication ceremony was held at **Central Arizona Fire and Medical Authority's (CAFMA)** property in the Upper Blue Hills. **CAFMA** recently had four 8,000-gallon water tanks installed on their property. These tanks will

be used as a refill site during firefighting operations. No wells will be used for the initial tank fill-up. This project has been in the works for a long time and has finally been completed! The tanks will greatly aid in the safety of the Upper Blue Hills residents. **A BIG THANK YOU** goes out to **CAFMA, the Dewey-Humboldt Firewise Committee and everyone else** who helped in making this dream a reality!

§ 153.086 OUTSIDE STORAGE

The question has come up many times about the ability of residents to use a travel trailer, motor home or recreational vehicle as occasional overflow guest room for relatives or guests. It is possible to do so, for a period not to exceed 90 days of continuous occupation, and subject to the following:

(4) *Temporary use of a travel trailer, motor home or recreational vehicle as an occasional overflow guest room for non-paying or non-reimbursing relatives or guests is authorized as outlined provided such interim use does not exceed 90 days of continuous duration or a total of 90 days in a year or one 12-month period. Temporary use of recreational vehicles shall be only authorized upon satisfaction of the following performance criteria:*

- (a) *Subject property is occupied by a permitted primary residential structure.*
- (b) *The Yavapai County Environmental Unit shall be furnished with information to determine that the septic or sanitary facilities are adequate to accommodate additional effluent from the temporary recreational vehicle (RV) unit installation.*
- (c) *Verification by the Zoning Administrator that the foregoing criteria have been addressed prior to authorizing occupancy of the unit.*

The Zoning Administrator will keep a log of those registering their guests and verifying clearance by Yavapai County.



P&Z ADVISORY COMMISSION VACANCY

The Town has one vacancy on the Planning and Zoning Advisory Commission and is looking for a Dewey-Humboldt citizen to become a Commission member. The term on the Commission is four-years.

The primary responsibilities of the Commission are to participate in the development and implementation of the Town's General Plan; periodically review the Town's Capital Improvement Program; and perform such other planning functions as the Mayor and Town Council may direct.

**BULGUR AND CANTALOUPE SALAD WITH
HAZELNUTS AND MINT (Perfect for a Potluck!)**

Juice of two oranges (about 3/4 cup)

2 tbsp. water

2 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil

1/2 tsp. salt, or to taste

4 green onions, white and green parts, sliced

1/4 cup flat-leaf parsley, chopped

1/4 cup toasted hazelnuts, chopped

1. Combine orange juice, lemon juice and water in medium saucepan over medium-high heat. Bring to a boil. Add bulgur and stir. Turn off heat, cover pan and let sit for 20 minutes or until liquid has been absorbed.

2. Meanwhile, in large bowl, whisk together oil, vinegar, salt and pepper. Stir in green onions, mint and parsley. Add cooked bulgur and stir well. Stir in cantaloupe.

3. Just before serving, sprinkle with hazelnuts.

Serve chilled or at room temperature.

Juice of half a lemon (2 Tbsp.)

1 cup medium-grain bulgur

1 tbsp. red wine vinegar

fresh-ground pepper to taste

1/2 cup mint, chopped

1 cantaloupe, cubed (4 cups)
