TOWN OF DEWEY-HUMBOLDT FALL CLEANUP PROGRAM

The Town of Dewey-Humboldt will be conducting its annual Fall Cleanup Program beginning September 3rd and continuing through September 6th. The location for drop off will be in downtown Humboldt at 12938 E. Main Street. The hours of operation will be from 8:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m.

As part of the Town's Firewise Program, we will be accepting brush and yard clippings. Dumpsters will be available to handle your discards and a separate area will be available to receive brush and yard clippings for later chipping and mulching.

Items that will not be accepted are: tires, oils, hazardous chemicals, batteries, household trash, refrigerators/freezers with freon/coolant canisters attached.

The Town will be making mulch available on an appointment basis beginning on Wednesday, September 11th, from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. until all of the mulch has been disposed of.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORNER

TEMPORARY HOUSING PERMITS

Currently Town Code of Dewey-Humboldt provides that the Building Official is authorized to issue a permit for temporary housing to be occupied during the life of an active building permit.

Town Code Section 153.036.B(8)

“Occupancy of temporary housing, including travel trailers, recreational vehicles and single-wide manufactured homes during the construction of a permanent dwelling is allowed during the 24-month period after the issuance of a building permit (and the building permit remains valid).

A permit for the temporary housing must be obtained prior to occupancy of the temporary dwelling unit. One extension of time for use of temporary housing may be granted at the discretion of the Zoning Administrator or his/her designee for a period not to exceed the maximum life of the original building permit for the permanent dwelling which is 30 months from its issuance date (24 months plus one six-month extension). Further extensions will require a use permit.”

Temporary housing permits must be applied for, approved and issued by the Building Official, prior to the occupancy of the temporary housing.

FROZEN LEMONADE PIE

- 1 pre-made graham cracker crust
- 1 can (14 oz.) sweetened condensed milk, chilled
- 1 container (12 oz.) frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 1 cup frozen lemonade concentrate, thawed
- Lemon slices, for garnish

In a large mixing bowl, fold the sweetened condensed milk and whipped topping until well combined, being careful to keep the mixture light and fluffy. Add the lemonade concentrate and continue to gently fold. Pour the filling into the pie crust. Place in the freezer to chill at least 8 hours or overnight.



Just before serving, garnish with fresh lemon slices.
