TOWN HALL MOVE UPDATE

After further consideration, Town Council voted to extend the lease at the current location, 2735 S. Highway 69, for one additional year. Council also directed staff to start the process to develop Town-owned property located at 12938 E. Main Street for a more permanent location for Town Hall.

SPECIAL ELECTION NOVEMBER 5, 2019

A Special Election has been called for Dewey-Humboldt voters to decide on whether or not to grant a franchise to APS. To see a copy of the proposed franchise agreement, with its terms and conditions, visit the Town's website, at www.dhaz.gov, or stop by Town Hall to review it.

FALL CLEANUP PROGRAM

The Town of Dewey-Humboldt conducted its Fall Cleanup Program from September 3rd—6th, accepting discarded items, along with brush and yard clippings.



It is estimated that there was 25% more discarded items collected and dumped than last year, as well as a larger volume of brush and yard clippings. The yard debris was chipped and mulched and distributed to the Community.

Public Works Supervisor Jason Berg hailed the event a great success crediting the hard work of his Public Work Staff and the participation of the Community!

GENERAL PLAN UPDATE BEGINNING

Every 10 years, the General Plan is required to be ratified by the voters. The current General Plan was adopted by Council on May 19, 2009.

The Town of Dewey-Humboldt is currently seeking Statements of Qualifications from qualified, licensed firms interested in providing professional services to update the Town of Dewey-Humboldt General Plan. State Statute mandates that municipalities prepare General Plans in accordance with "Growing Smarter" legislation. These plans are comprehensive and describe the vision, goals and policies of the Town. The document identifies a staff responsibility to identify how each proposed Council action relates to the following values: **Active Citizenship; Sustainable Development; Creating Community; Self-Reliance; Efficient Public Services; Limited Public Services; Durable Public Improvements.**

Scope of Work

Much of the information in the current adopted General Plan mentioned above including, but not limited to, various elements, tables/charts, maps, and goals and policies are anticipated to be retained and/or updated where necessary. The Town of Dewey-Humboldt included all the following elements in our current General Plan and will be included in our update: **Land Use; Circulation; Open Space/Trails; Growth Area; Environmental Planning; Cost of Development; Water Resources. Optional Elements for Consideration: Conservation; Aggregate; Recreation; Public Buildings; Housing; Safety; Energy.**

The consultant will initially, as Phase 1, be assisting the community in evaluating and appraising the effectiveness and continuing relevance of each element of the existing plan and exploring with the community any new elements needed to be added.

The results of the evaluation and appraisal from Phase 1 will be used by the firm contracted to develop the scope of work for the update of each element and the development of the new elements, including background data, analysis, and goals and objectives, as Phase 2 under separate contract.

Additionally, the consultant will provide support in recommending plan framework, coordinating facilitating citizen participation and community outreach, plan editing and drafting, data collection and analysis to support the update of each element as, including graphics and diagrams, maps, public surveying, public meetings, staff meetings and any related items that are necessary in moving the update of the General Plan forward in a manner consistent with Arizona Revised Statutes, Town of Dewey-Humboldt Laws and Regulations and in concert with the goals and policies of the Mayor and Council.

It is anticipated that additional elements may be included to support various Town goals and policies identified through this process.

Public involvement will be a major component of the update effort and it is anticipated that a Stakeholders Committee would be formed to direct the consultant's work throughout the process.

WINTERTIME SAFETY TIPS

Gas Fuel Appliances: Change out air filters, check appliances for gas leaks and check out exhaust and combustible air ventilation systems. It is recommended to have a licensed mechanical contractor do a complete check-up on the gas heating system. A carbon monoxide detector is also a highly recommended device if you use gas-fuel appliances.

Smoke Alarms: Replace the batteries and *TEST* the alarms to make sure they are in good working order.

Wood Stove/Fireplace/Pellet

Stove: Clean the flue/exhaust pipes regularly to ensure your appliances work more efficiently.

Doors and Windows: Replace any worn out weather stripping around the doors and windows.

SAFELY DISPOSE OF EXPIRED OR UNUSED DRUGS

From Prescott Valley Utilities Department

Do you have medications that have expired, or are for a health issue that is no longer present, or are



for individuals that are no longer is residence? Medications should be properly disposed of if they no longer serve the purpose

they were intended for. Proper disposal will prevent accidental ingestion and keep them out of the hands of individuals that shouldn't have access to them.

Disposing of unused medications by flushing them down the toilet or pouring them down the drain may seem to be an expedient way to handle the situation but that practice is not environmentally sound. Septic tanks and wastewater treatment plants are usually unable to remove all of the medicinal compounds and the substances end up in our rivers, lakes and groundwater. Research has shown that even low concentrations of the medications can impact aquatic life and other organisms.

How can you help? The Prescott Valley Police Department has partnered with MATFORCE by supporting their "Dump the Drugs" program aimed at providing the community with a way to properly dispose of any unused or unwanted prescription drugs they have in their homes.

Citizens wishing to drop off unused prescription medications for disposal can do so by coming to the Town's Police Department at 7601 E Civic Circle and contacting staff at the customer service window Monday through Friday from 8am to 5pm.





Gone But Not Forgotten

ZUCCHINI BREAD WITH CHERRIES, CHOCOLATE & CARDAMOM

From Dishing up the Dirt

Prep Time: 15 minutes

Cook Time: 55 minutes

Serves: 1 loaf

Ingredients:

1/2 c. hazelnut oil (or another neutral tasting oil)

1/2 c. honey

2 eggs, lightly beaten

1 tsp. pure vanilla extract

1 1/2 c. coarsely grated zucchini

1/2 c. fresh cherries, pitted & halved

3/4 c. all-purpose flour

3/4 c. whole wheat flour

1/2 tsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp. baking soda

1 tsp. ground cardamom

1/2 tsp. fine sea salt

1/2 c. dark chocolate chips

1/2 c. toasted hazelnuts, chopped

Preparation:

Place an oven rack in the middle of your oven and pre-heat to 350F.

In a large bowl, beat oil and honey together. Stir in the eggs, vanilla and zucchini. Mix until well combined then gently fold in the cherries.

In a separate bowl, whisk together the flours, baking powder, baking soda, cardamom, and salt. Stir the dry ingredients into the wet ingredients (being careful to not over-mix) and add the chocolate chips and hazelnuts.

Pour the batter into a lightly greased 8 1/2-by-4 1/2-inch loaf pan. Bake until a toothpick inserted in the center of the bread comes out clean, 50-60 minutes. Cool the zucchini bread in the pan for about 15 minutes, then transfer it to a wire rack to cool completely.
