NEWS FROM TOWN HALL

STEERING COMMITTEE VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The Town is currently looking for individuals who would like to be involved with the Town's General Plan update. A Steering Committee is being formed to help with the update process. Enclosed with this Newsletter is a General Plan Steering Committee Application Form. If you are interested in being involved with the General Plan update, please fill out the enclosed application and submit to the Town by April 28, 2020.

GENERAL PLAN UPDATE

The Town has contracted with PLAN*et to assist in the General Plan update. State Statute mandates that municipalities prepare General Plans in accordance with "Growing Smarter" legislation. These plans are comprehensive and describe the vision, goals and policies of the Town. The final document will recognize core values such as:

- **Active Citizenship**
- **Sustainable Development**
- **Creating Community**
- **Self-Reliance**
- **Efficient Public Services**
- **Limited Public Services**
- **Durable Public Improvements**

PLAN*et will initially, as Phase 1, be assisting the community in evaluating and appraising the effectiveness and continuing relevance of each element of the existing plan and exploring with the community any new elements needed to be added. Phase 1 is to be the focus of this first phase.

The results of the evaluation and appraisal from Phase 1 will be used by PLAN*et to develop the scope of work for the update of each element and the development of the new elements, including background data, analysis, and goals and objectives, as Phase 2 under separate contract.

Additionally, PLAN*et will provide support in recommending plan frame-

work, coordinating facilitating citizen participation and community outreach, plan editing and drafting, data collection and analysis to support the update of each element by, including graphics and diagrams, maps, public surveying, public meetings, staff meetings and any related items that are necessary in moving the update of the General Plan forward in a manner consistent with Arizona Revised Statutes, Town of Dewey-Humboldt Laws and Regulations and in concert with the goals and policies of the Mayor and Council.



Governor Ducey launches the ArizonaTogether.org initiative to support Arizonans during the COVID-19 outbreak, connecting individuals and businesses to resources, raising money for community organizations and providing information on volunteer opportunities.

The ArizonaTogether.org initiative brings together the growing list of resources and information being offered by state agencies and community partners. 

TOWN BOUNDARIES vs. ZIP CODE BOUNDARIES

The Town of Dewey-Humboldt is composed of 18.9 square miles and has a population of roughly 4,000. There are two zip codes assigned to the Town (86327 Dewey & 86329 Humboldt). The following map gives an approximate depiction of the Town of Dewey-Humboldt on the zip code map.

The 86327 and 86329 zip codes cover just over 236 square miles and have a population of well over 10,000. A vast majority of the two zip codes are located within the unincorporated areas of Yavapai County. The Prescott Country Club has areas that are located in Yavapai County and areas that are located in the Town of Prescott Valley. The Quailwood Meadows Subdivision and Orchard Ranch RV Park are also assigned the 86327 zip code but are in the Town of Prescott Valley.

- Locations and dimensions of any existing structures, wells and septic systems

Following approval of the preliminary Land Split drawing, it will be necessary to submit a record of survey of the proposed Land Split produced, signed and sealed by a registered Land Surveyor, and including the recording date, book and page, as well as a certification line for the signature of the Community Planner for the Town.

Any Land Divisions that occur outside of the Town Land Split or Subdivision process will not be recognized for the issuance of building permits until the error is corrected.

All proposed land splits that involve lots within a recorded subdivision shall be heard before the Town Council as a revision of the Final Plat, pursuant to Town of Dewey-Humboldt Code off Ordinances Section 152.11

SPRING CLEAN-UP

The Town of Dewey-Humboldt will be conducting its annual **Spring Clean Up Program** beginning **May 26th** and continuing **through May 29th**. The location for drop off will be at the Public Works' yard located at **S. Dana and E. Third Streets**. The hours will be from 8:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m.

As part of the Town's **Firewise Program**, we **will be** accepting brush and yard clippings. Dumpsters will be available to handle your discards and a separate area will be available to receive brush and yard clippings for later chipping and mulching.

Items that **will not be** accepted are: **tires, oils, hazardous chemicals, batteries, household trash, refrigerators/freezers with freon/coolant canisters attached.**

The mulch will be available, on an appointment basis, beginning on Monday, **June 3rd**, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. until all of the mulch has been disposed of.

WHAT IS A LAND SPLIT?

The Town of Dewey-Humboldt has adopted a Land Split process to facilitate the division of smaller parcels without the necessity of going through a full subdivision process. A Land Split involves the division of land creating not more than three (3) parcels from a parent parcel that is 2 ½ acres or less in area, and where no new street is involved, for the purpose of sale or lease. Calculation of the three (3) splits allowed will be cumulative over the past five (5) years, and the applicant will be required to submit evidence of that history.

Proposed Land Splits require a pre-application conference with the Community Development Department to discuss the process to be followed and the requirements to be met. Those requirements will include:

- Legal description and parcel number
- A Land Split drawing, fully dimensioned and prepared to scale
- Proposed parcels, with parcels lines fully dimensioned
- Any rights-of-way within the property

DEWEY-HUMBOLDT MAGISTRATE COURT





Regular attendance is required for board, commission and committee members. If a member misses three meetings consecutively or within a calendar quarter and the chair recommends removal, his seat is deemed vacant upon declaration by the Council.

Board, commission and citizen committee members are required to comply with Arizona open meeting laws and public records laws and with the Town of Dewey-Humboldt Code of Ethics.

MAPLE-ROASTED SWEET POTATOES

2 1/2 lbs. sweet potatoes, peeled & cut into 1 1/2" pieces
1/3 cup maple syrup
2 tbsp. melted butter
1 tbsp. lemon juice
1/2 tsp. salt
ground pepper to taste



Preheat oven to 400.

Arrange potatoes in an even layer in a 9" x 13" glass baking dish. Combine syrup, butter, lemon juice, salt and pepper; toss to coat. Cover with foil.

Bake for 15 minutes. Remove the foil. Stir and continue baking, stirring every 15 minutes until tender and starting to brown—45 to 50 minutes more.


