

2020 ELECTION

The Town's 2020 Candidate elections will be for the Mayoral (two-year term of office) and three Town Council seats (four-year terms of office).

Dates to keep in mind:

June 25—Write-in Candidate Deadline

July 6—Voter Registration Deadline for the Primary Election

July 8—Early Voting Begins/
Early Ballots are Mailed

August 4—Primary Election Day

October 5—Voter Registration
Deadline for the General Election

November 3—General Election Day

GENERAL PLAN UPDATE BEGINNING

The Town has appointed the Steering Committee members and they are looking to hold their first meeting in late June.

The Town has contracted with PLAN*et to assist in the General Plan update. State Statute mandates that municipalities prepare General Plans in accordance with "Growing Smarter" legislation. These plans are comprehensive and describe the vision, goals and policies of the Town. The document identifies a staff responsibility to identify how each proposed Council action relates to the following values:

- Active Citizenship
- Sustainable Development
- Creating Community
- Self-Reliance
- Efficient Public Services
- Limited Public Services
- Durable Public Improvements
- Scope of Work

Much of the information in the current adopted General Plan mentioned above including, but not limited to, various elements, tables/charts, maps, and goals and policies are anticipated to be retained and/or updated where necessary. The Town of Dewey-Humboldt included all the following elements in our current General Plan and will be included in our update: Land Use; Circulation; Open Space/Trails; Growth Area; Environmental Planning; Cost of Development; and Water Resources. Optional Elements for Consideration: Conservation; Aggregate; Recreation; Public Buildings; Housing; Safety; and Energy.

The consultant will initially, as Phase 1, be assisting the community in evaluating and appraising the effectiveness and continuing relevance of each element of the existing plan and exploring with the community any new elements needed to be added. Phase 1 is to be the focus of this first phase.

The results of the evaluation and appraisal from Phase 1 will be used by the firm contracted to develop the scope of work for the update of each element and the development of the new elements, including background data, analysis, and goals and objectives, as Phase 2 under separate contract.

Additionally, the consultant will provide support in recommending plan framework, coordinating facilitating citizen participation and community outreach, plan editing and drafting, data collection and analysis to support the update of each element as, including graphics and diagrams, maps, public surveying, public meetings, staff

meetings and any related items that are necessary in moving the update of the General Plan forward in a manner consistent with Arizona Revised Statutes, Town of Dewey-Humboldt Laws and Regulations and in concert with the goals and policies of the Mayor and Council.

It is anticipated that additional elements may be included to support various Town goals and policies identified through this process.

**SPRING CHIPSEAL
PROJECT**

Over the next 60 days, the Public Works Department will begin the annual Spring Chipseal Project. The project will entail a chip overlay of existing roads throughout town with a fog (a thin liquid oil) coating once



the chips are applied.

There will be message boards up in the area of Kachina Road; the area of Foothill Drive, south of State Route 169; and in the area of Main Street, east of Highway 69 for three days prior to the scheduled work. Please note the days that are scheduled and have the roads free of parked vehicles.

**CHAPTER 150.00
(BUILDING CODES)
SECTION 105.2.1
(BUILDING PERMITS)**

A building permit shall not be required for the following: One-story detached accessory buildings on residential properties used as tool and storage sheds, garages, carports, playhouses, animal shades, barns, and similar uses, provided the area

does not exceed 400 sq. ft. under roof and not to exceed a height of 12' from natural grade to the mean roof height. The site of the accessory building must meet all setbacks. Any plumbing, mechanical, and electrical to structure will require a separate building permit. Detached accessory buildings shall not be considered or used as habitable space. A separate building permit is required for any plumbing, electrical or mechanical systems in all detached buildings.

Note: A zoning permit will be required for sheds, 400 sq. ft. or less in size, and extensions to existing detached accessory structures. The zoning clearance fee is \$15.

One thing that is not going to take a break during this pandemic is the upcoming wildfire season. Right now it is here, on schedule, and as potentially dangerous as ever. The first 2020 Arizona wildfire has already occurred and based on InciWeb, as of May 13th, Northern Arizona has had two active wildfires that have consumed almost 39,000 acres (Note: Dewey-Humboldt is roughly 1/3 that size). ALL of Dewey-Humboldt (excluding government lands) is within a Wildland/Urban Interface area, which simply means that we're all within a high-risk area for wildland fires. Be prepared! Every year YOUR Dewey-Humboldt Firewise Community needs to validate their designation by submitting to the parent organization NFPA (National Fire Protection Agency) proof that they and the community are actively involved in continuing the education and actions needed to enhance our Firewise culture, and you can help. Predominantly we use volunteer hours, but things you already do throughout the year can also be counted. It costs nothing more – simply you letting us know that, from an extensive list of typical home improvements, you have spent time and/or money making your property a bit more fire safe, can be added to the list of what we all have done throughout the year. Below are a few common examples and if you're interested the entire list titled **Time and Expense Investment Examples** can be found at our Facebook page (**Dewey-Humboldt Blue Hills/Foothills East Firewise**), or the NFPA @nfpa.org.

Time and Expense Investment Examples:

Think about the things you normally do on your property during the spring and monsoon seasons:

- Move your wood pile back away from your home
- Rake up yard debris (leaves, pine needles, small tree limbs, dead plants)
- Trim up trees and shrubs around the house
- Did you purchase new tools for the yard this year (weed whacker, mower, sprayer, trimmers)
- Any big investments like a new roof, siding, fencing
- Were you involved in a mitigation grant from Firewise?





**AFRICAN PEANUT STEW
W/SWEET POTATOES**

By Shanti Rade, Whipstone Farm

- 2 lbs. boneless, skinless chicken
- 3 sweet potatoes, peeled & chopped
- 3/4 cup creamy peanut butter
- 28 oz. can diced tomatoes, undrained
- 1 1/2 cup chicken broth
- 1 tbsp. dried minced onion flakes
- 1 tsp. ground ginger
- 2 tbsp. tomato paste
- 2 tsp. curry powder
- 1 tsp. red pepper flakes
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 2 limes, cut in wedges (for garnish)

Using a 6 quart slow cooker put chicken in first followed by sweet potatoes, peanut butter, tomatoes and broth. Add the dried onions and all the spices. Don't worry about stirring it. Cover and cook on low for 6 to 8 hours or 4 to 5 hours on high.

Stir well and serve with a squeeze of lime juice. Enjoy!
